EDITORIAL COMMENT

On Thuyday, March 18th, 1936, Vice-Presided Scrylo Omeña, as yuet of hono oad spenker, after being introduced by Dr. Carlos P. Romule, Predient of the Chib, gave on epochal address before the Rotary Chib of Manila in which he wayed vital changes in the clusctional program of the Commonwealth. This address, his first public utterness atter officially, assuming the portfolio of Secretary of Public Instruction, may prove to be the keyprote for reforms which will help gave elevational emphasis to the economic future and vector of the sation, which admittedly has not been sufficiently done in the post.

Other quests of honor included the members of President Quezon's newly appointed advisory National Council on Education of which Dr. Rafael Palma is chairman. The members of the Council were introduced by Edward L. Hall. Chairman of the Vocational Service Committee of the Rotary Club. Dr. Hall also save a short address preceding his introductions in which he explained the work the Rotary Club was attempt. ing in cooperation with the Journal of Education; and in the free distribution of thousands of booklets on various obcupational subjects to the various schols throughout the archipelago. In particular he also stressed the necessity of a surven for the purpose of promosticating possible future occupations which could be ascertained from a new consus of the normation. "This". he said, "is absolutely fundamental and the starting point for any scientific vocational guidance which can and should be offered to the wouth of this country. We believe such a survey would also go a long way toward solving the big administrative questions of what kind of schools are needed, or what courses of study should be offered in the future".

Vice-President Osmeña's address follows in full, and is published under the Journal's Vocational Guidance Scotion because of the very direct bearing it has upon the future of Vocational Guidance in the Philippine Islands.
